Preparing for the Home Inspection



____Check that all utilities are on, especially if home is vacant

___Leave keys that are clearly labeled to any locked areas

____Make sure the electrical panel, water heater, furnace and other appliances are accessible ____Pull things away from the basement and garage walls so they can be observed with a flashlight at least ____Remove pets (and yourself) during the inspection

____Most inspections will be done in 2 hours but plan to be gone for 4 hour window just in case.

GARAGE

- ____Check garage doors for any damage, make sure the auto reverse feature is working
- ___Look for cracks in the concrete floor and foundation walls, also for termite tubes
- ____Repair drywall tape if it is peeling off or missing

EXTERIOR

____Make sure outdoor water spigots are functioning and not leaking

____Walk the perimeter and look for holes in siding, repair with caulk if needed

___Look for damaged window screens and repair or replace

____Gutters need to be clean of debris and downspouts need to point away from the foundation

____Trim bushes away from the foundation and do a light landscaping job so it looks maintained

____If any concerns, have a roofer check the condition to take care of repairs ahead of inspection

INTERIOR

___Change air filters

____Check that all windows open and the lock functions properly, also look for cracked panes and broken thermal seals

Put new batteries in the smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors

____Replace burned out light bulbs

____Make sure electrical outlets are all functioning

____Repair leaking faucets and check for leaks underneath sinks around toilets & tubs and at the laundry connections

____Make sure water heater, furnace, and A/C unit are cleaned off and have them serviced professionally, if needed
